CALL TO ORDER

Mayor Bob Brasses called the Board of Aldermen Meeting of the City of Fenton, St. Louis County, Missouri to order at 7:00 p.m. on Thursday, March 24, 2022. The meeting was held at Fenton City Hall and via Zoom Videoconference (RSMo 610.015).

Brad Christ 10645 Hackamore Lane, St. Louis 63128, introduced himself as he is running for election to the Missouri House of Representatives to represent District 96 Republican Party. States are in the process of redistricting congressional and state legislative boundaries following the 2020 census. The district now includes a mixture of Sunset Hills, Fenton, Sappington, Crestwood, and parts of unincorporated South County. Primary election is August 2, 2022 and general election is November 8, 2022.

Alderman Maurath explained typically the Board will request a waiver of the rules for a second reading the same day the first reading is read but noted this topic is too important and he agrees that another month is appropriate to ensure residents have time to understand what is happening and have an opportunity to ask questions and weigh in on the decision.

The properties are addressed as 405 and 487 Old Smizer Mill Road and are zoned “C-1” Commercial District.

VI. PARK & RECREATION – Ald. Huels, Liaison

Eric Robeck, 1476 Bent Oak Ridge Court, Fenton, MO 63026 – shared he wished to address the topics of tree planting and water plants before the Board tonight. He noted the Board approved \$20,000 for invasive species control and planting in the parks in the 2022 budget. With the amount estimated for Westside, Riverside and the Center Street property planting totaling almost half the budgeted amount, as the city has other parks, he sees how this request could seem excessive. But, there is one other request for funding for ADA ramp at Bud Weil park with the estimated cost unknown at this time, and he does not feel a \$10,000 budget to plant trees where trees used to be located but have died, is an unreasonable request. Eric shared there is \$100,000 budgeted for tree removal in the parks this year but feels better long-term vision is to plant trees for beautification rather than remove trees without replacing them. His other request is for Westside, the Missouri Department of Conservation (MDC) officials, Mark Grueber-Forester, Kevin Manno (retired), and Josh Ward-ecologist, recommended instead of riprap, to plant native water vegetation along the margins to restore ecological systems. Eric asked the Board to consider his requests to better the parks.

Alderman Maurath acknowledged Mr. Robeck as a former Parks and Recreation member as he just recently submitted his resignation and thanked him for his service.
